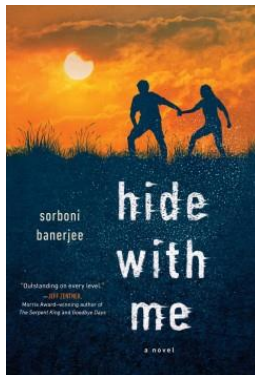


MYSTERIES

Jones, fourteen, and her mother flee Georgia for small-town Ohio but three years later she learns that his misdeeds may have jeopardized not just her future but also her life.



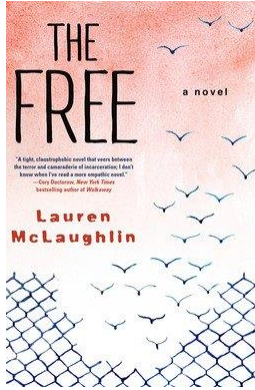
Allegedly by Tiffany Jackson

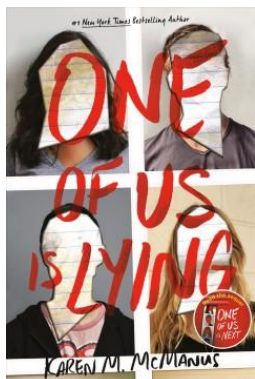
Jackaby by William Ritter
