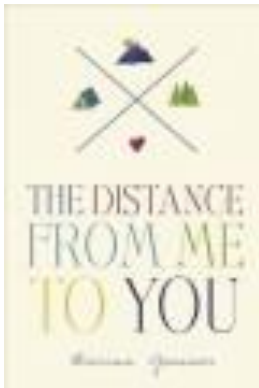

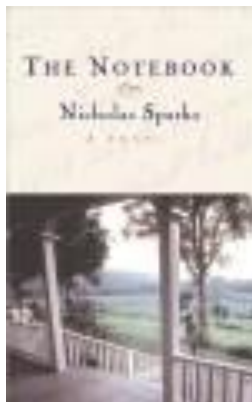
Not After Everything by Michelle Levy

"After his mom kills herself, Tyler shuts out the world--until falling in love with Jordyn helps him find his way toward a hopeful future"--.



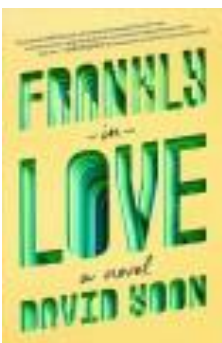
Once and For All by Sarah Dessen

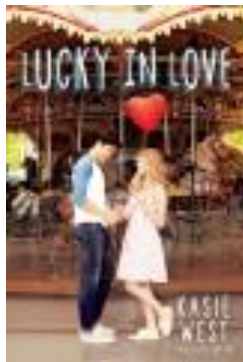
The Notebook by Nicholas Sparks
